## NHS Flu Season 2018/19

There's been another update to the last communication earlier in November regarding the shortages of Adrenaline Auto-injectors (AAI). From 29<sup>th</sup> November, the 150mcg auto-injectors will no longer be subject to additional validation processes.

## This week's key actions are:

- 1. Keep up with the focus on all eligible people being asked whether they have had their flu vaccination yet. All aTIV stock for the over 65s has now been distributed, so it's key now to work hard throughout December to catch -up and then overtake the number of vaccinations performed in community pharmacy last year.
- 2. Thinking ahead to next year.... Public Health England have issued guidance on which vaccines have so far been approved for ordering for the 2019/20 season.

A quick look at our performance for November YTD demonstrates a later profile than in previous years (based on PharmOutcomes data only – hence not recording all pharmacies activities)

Oct '18 YTD v Oct '17 YTD -25.6% 32,187 v 43,246

Nov '18 YTD v Dec '17 YTD -10.4% 45,168 v 50,424 (but now +4% on Oct '17 YTD)

It's still all to play for. A mighty 13,000 vaccines were delivered in November to bring us back on line.





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
