## December meeting of the Community Pharmacy Brexit Forum

Today PSNC hosted the Community Pharmacy Brexit Forum hearing updates from a number of organisations, including NHS England and NHS Improvement (NHSE&I) and the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC).

The meeting followed the <u>helpful update last week on EU exit – medicines supply</u> <u>continuity – to all GPs and community pharmacists from Keith Ridge, the Chief</u> <u>Pharmaceutical Officer for England</u>.

NHSE&I gave key updates on primary and community care including messages to:

- Prescribe and dispense as normal;
- Ensure you are familiar with the latest information on supply disruption;
- Encourage patients to take out travel insurance before travelling to the EU; and
- Encourage staff who are EU citizens to register with the EU Settlement Scheme.

There was also an update on the work of the Medicines Shortages Response Group, and the DHSC provided a comprehensive update on the multi-layered approach to maintaining continuity of supply of medicines.

## **APPG issues report warning of pressures on pharmacies**

The All-Party Pharmacy Group (APPG) has today published a report following its inquiry into the pressures of COVID-19 on the pharmacy sector, which has warned that some pharmacies could be forced to close unless further Government support is pledged.

According to a survey undertaken as part of the inquiry, nearly 8 out of 10 pharmacy contractors felt the financial support offered so far (the  $\pm$ 370m advanced payments) has not been enough to mitigate financial pressures.

The report makes a series of policy recommendations on what support the sector needs to remain sustainable, including asking the Government to consider boosting overall funding in recognition of both the great financial pressures faced and the huge contribution made to frontline healthcare during the pandemic.

## January 2021 Category M Prices Announced

The Drug Tariff Category M pricelist for January 2021 has been published. This reflects natural reductions to prices due to changes in the buying costs of medicines in the reference period, along with an uplift to ensure margin run rates proceed at the desired level.

However, PSNC also pressed DHSC to retain the previous £15m per quarter uplift included in October's Drug Tariff. The Committee felt that, given that this list would take effect in the immediate aftermath of the end of the Brexit Transition Period, it would be prudent to try and maintain some stability of medicine reimbursement prices.
